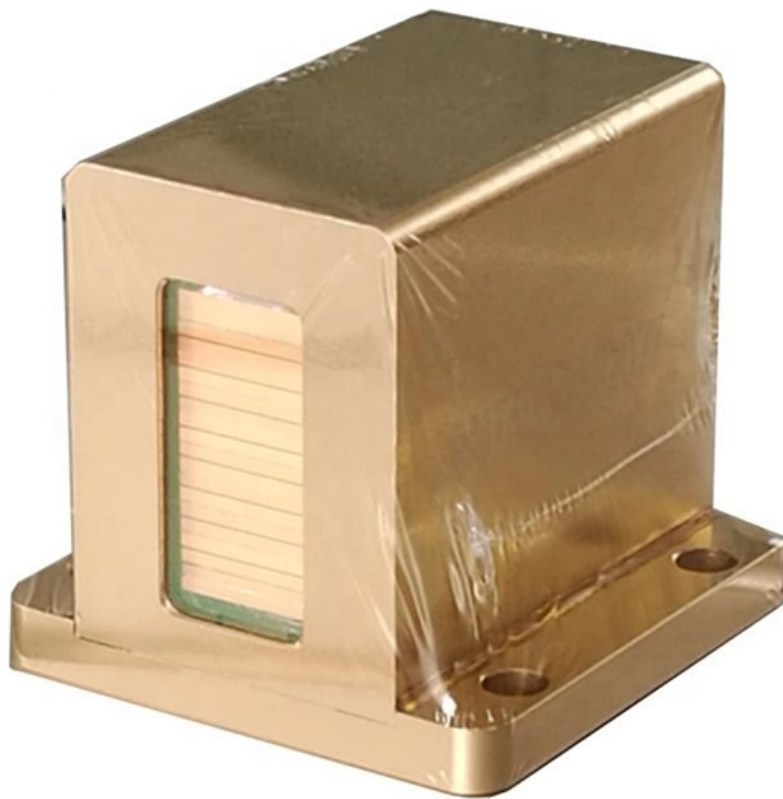

Link aggregation allows you to combine multiple Ethernet links into a single logical link between two networked devices. Unmanaged switches may be susceptible to loops (no Spanning Tree support), have no broadcast control (no VLAN support), and lack support for features such as Quality of Service (QoS) and Link Aggregation or Trunking.

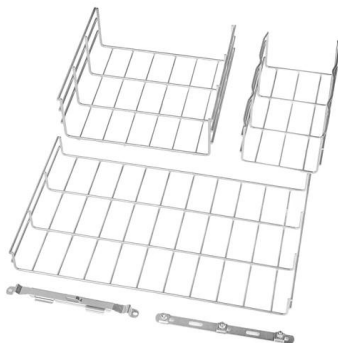
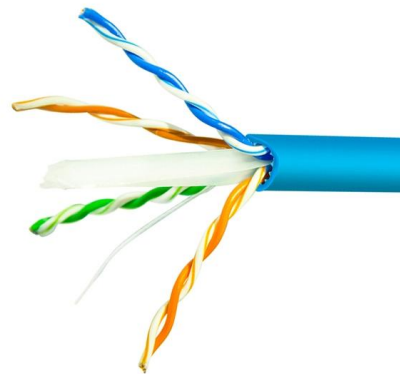
