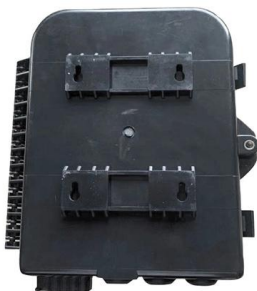


Rack Specifications

The minimum vertical rack space per chassis must be two rack units (RUs), equal to 3.5 inches (8.8 cm) . The distance between the chassis air vents and any walls should be 2.5 inches (6.4 cm).

Space requirements

Allow for this when you are planning the movement of the system from the unloading point to its permanent location. The following figure shows the space requirements for each rack. Figure 1.

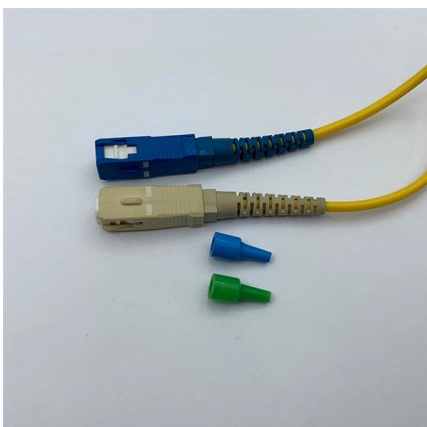

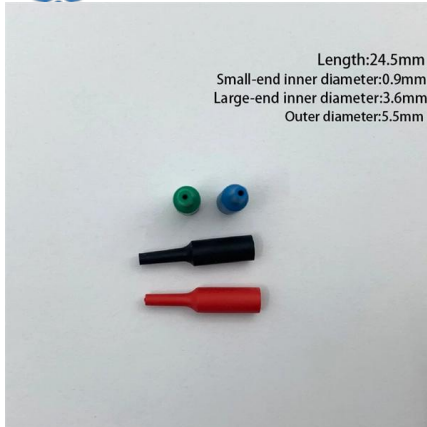
